Field Trial Standing Instructions

RULES & REGULATIONS GOVERNING ALL STAKES: ALL TRIALS WILL BE HELD UNDER KENNEL CLUB FIELD TRIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS AND THOSE OF THE HVS

- 1 Dogs entered at Kennel Club Licensed Field Trials must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B.
- 2 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made.
All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.
- 3 If entries or nominations exceed the number of permitted runners, the right to compete in a Trial shall be decided by ballot.
- 4 Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them will be reported to the Kennel Club.
- 5 No modification may be made to the schedule after publication except by permission of the Kennel Club, followed by advertisement in appropriate journals if time permits before the closing of entries.
- 6 Judges at a Trial are prohibited from entering a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership.
- 7 Videography and photography will only be permitted with the express permission of the Chief Steward and the host.
- 8 Welfare of Dogs: An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs' health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
- 9 Substitution of Dogs will not be accepted.

RUNNERS:

There will be a maximum of twelve runners in each stake

Entry fees for Field Trials: are £25 for members and £35 non-members. Please send separate cheques for each trial. Cheques made payable to Hungarian Vizsla Society, name and address on back of cheque.

There will be a 50% refund if a trial is cancelled due to bad weather. Unused Cheques will be destroyed.

ENTRIES:

An entry is an application for a named dog, registered at the Kennel Club in the name of applicant. Completed entry forms must be sent together with the appropriate payment to:

The HVS may reserve to itself the right to refuse any entry.

Draw:

The draw for each stake will take place as indicated under each Stake details.

When an applicant has been successful in the draw for a place in a Stake, or as a reserve, has accepted an offer of a run, if the run is not taken up the applicant may become liable for the full entry fee, if his place is not taken up by another competitor, except where the applicant has qualified out of Novice Stakes

(where applicable) or where the dog draw to run has qualified for the Championship after entries have closed, or on production of a Veterinary certificate confirming that the dog entered for the Stake is unfit to compete or on production of a Medical certificate that the applicant or applicants nominated handler is unable to compete

When dogs are owned in joint partnership, two dogs may be entered equally in the draw providing a different handler, handles each dog.

Owners entering more than one in the event of over subscription, please state preference in the draw.

Except in Open Stakes No owner shall be allowed a second entry until all owner/handlers (members) have had a first entry.

DEFINITIONS:

Members: Members are those that are fully paid up

Non-Members include those applying for membership or whose membership has lapsed and have not yet been before the committee for consideration.

Novice: A Stake confined to dogs, which have not gained the following awards.

First, Second or Third in an Open Stake or First, Second in an All-Aged Stake or First in Novice Stakes.
Preference in the DRAW will be given to MEMBERS.

Dogs are ineligible for entry in a Novice Stake immediately following a win.

All-Aged: A stake which is open to all dogs of a specified breed or breeds without restriction to their age but which may be restricted by any other condition which may be determined by the Society promoting the Field Trial.

Preference in the draw will be given to those dogs with an award in a Field Trial in the following order:

- (a) Members with HV's
- (b) Members entering other breeds.
- (c) Others.

OPEN: A Stake in which dogs have the opportunity of gaining qualification (whole or part) for the title of Field Trial Champion or for entry in the Championship Stake.

Preference in the draw will be given to:

- (a) Members dogs which have gained a First, Second, Third award in an Open Stake or a First or Second in an All-Aged Stake, or First in a Novice.
- (b) Non-Members dogs which have gained a First, Second, Third award in an Open Stake or a First or Second in an All-Aged Stake, or First in a Novice.
- (c) Members dogs which have gained other awards.
- (d) Non-Members dogs which have gained other awards.
- (e) Other dogs.

Kennel Club Guidelines. Special Water Certificates - J(E) 10c

The Special Water test Certificate is issued on the rare occasion that a Water Test is not possible at a HPR Stake due to weather conditions. It is not a mandatory requirement as it takes place once the trial is over, and is taken at the dog owners own risk. If an owners not comfortable with the arrangements for taking the Special Water Test (ie; if the Landowners permission has not been sought, or there is a perceived risk

Of injury) then the individual can refuse to take part and re-arrange to take the test at another Field Trial Which would be covered by a Clubs Insurance.

The Kennel Club gives this advice without prejudice if an incident occurs it would be a matter for the insurance company concerned to interpret and it is always best practise to contact your insurer if in doubt

SHOW GUNDOG WORKING CERTIFICATE:

Entries for The Show Gundog Working Certificate will be accepted at stakes indicated under stake details. A maximum of two such entries will be accepted at the appointed Stake. A dog which has won one or more C.C.s at shows may be entered for a SGWC at a Field Trial meeting. To gain a Qualifying Certificate a dog must Hunt, Point and Retrieve tenderly, enter water and swim. Absolute steadiness in not essential. Closing dates are as per the Stakes and a **Standard Entry** form **must** be used. Where the number of entries exceeds two, preference will be given to **Show Champions**

SGWC. Is described above ,it allows a Show Champion to carry the title of **Champion** when awarded.

Entry fees for SGWC: are £25 for members and £35 for non-members.

Meeting and Starting Times

Competitors should report to the Chief Steward not later than 15mins.prior to the published starting time.

For the purpose of substitution of reserves the trial will be deemed to have commenced when the Chief Steward calls the Competitors and Judges together and makes the introductions.

Picking Up Dog: At each Stake there will be a dog whose sole purpose is to retrieve any game not recovered by dogs running in the stake.

Bitches: No bitches in season on the ground.

Exercise of Dogs: Competitors may exercise their dogs only at the discretion of the Chief Steward. Under no circumstances are dogs to be run or exercised on the trial ground before the trial. Persons in breach of this rule will be liable to have any entry disqualified and their fees forfeited.

Liability: All persons attending these trials do so at their own risk. Neither the HVS or the Host of the meeting will accept liability for accident, injury or illness, damage or loss to any person, dogs or property , whatsoever. The Society reserves the right to refuse entry without stating a reason. The makeup of any entry implies acceptance of these conditions and of the rules of the Kennel Club and the HVS The attendance of any spectator also implies such acceptance.

Red Flag: Competitors and Spectators must at all times obey the directions of the stewards. They must keep together behind the Red Flag and are requested to keep noise levels to a minimum to avoid disturbing the trial.

Lunches Competitors and Spectators should make their own lunch arrangements at all stakes.
