HUNGARIAN VIZSLA SOCIETY

The Hungarian Vizsla Society has a selection panel for choosing judges who are knowledgeable in the breed, whether breed specialists or non-breed specialists, with the integrity to judge without fear or favour.

Our Selection Panel consists of experienced members who work closely with our judging list maintainers, with the aim of selecting judges for our Open Shows and Special Award Classes who need the numbers to progress towards CC status and who have the support of the society. Our Championship Show judges are required to have a gap of at least 2 years since their last appointment in the breed. Irrespective of the level of show, every member of the selection panel puts forward names for consideration and every name is discussed and voted on by the whole panel.

As has been the case since our first ever shows, members of the Hungarian Vizsla Society Committee and Show Sub-Committee are permitted to enter and handle their own or other dogs under any judge officiating at our shows; our only stipulation being that lunch is not taken at the same time as the judge if showing/handling post-lunch.

MEET YOUR JUDGES

Open Show Judge: Daniela Tranquada (Castanho)

I was born into a dog-loving household with Weimaraners and GSPs in the late 70s. I started in junior handling, showing everything I could get my hands on and qualified for the semi-finals at Richmond Championship Show at age 10 by winning with a Chihuahua!

In 1994 I started judging Gundogs and was approved to award CCs in Weimaraners in 2010. I judge all Gundog breeds at Open Shows, and I have passed a hands-on assessment for the Hungarian Vizsla.

Over the years, I have successfully handled many dogs of various breeds including the Hungarian Vizsla, and being a geeky sort interested in breed history, I have a good knowledge of the breed's foundations and kennels of the past.

My whole life has been and continues to be dedicated to the world of dogs both professionally and personally, and I am very honoured and excited to be judging at your show.

Special Award Classes Judge: Lorraine Yarnley (Cherrybower)

I inherited my love of dogs at a very young age from my parents, and had a wonderful childhood being brought up with various Gundog breeds including Cocker Spaniels, Italian Spinones and English Setters. As a family we had our first Show Champion English Setter in 1980, culiminating in winning the CC at Crufts. I was very lucky as a young girl to have the opportunity to show Marnie on occasion when my mother and father would allow it!

I remember the first time I ever saw a Hungarian Vizsla, standing in a queue with my mum at Crufts. We both remember vividly how struck we were by this beautifully stunning breed. Not long after this we welcomed our first Vizsla, Poppy into our family in 2005. Since then, I have actively shown and worked all our Vizslas, winning many awards with them all. I started to judge the breed in 2014.

I am an avid supported of the Hungarian Vizsla, having been a Trustee on the Hungarian Vizsla Welfare Charity, past committee member of The Hungarian Vizsla Club and an officer on The South of England Gundog Club. I also enjoy being a committee member and trainer at our local ring craft club. It is always a privilege and honour to have the opportunity to judge our beautiful breed.

Only dogs entered in the main show are eligible for entry into the Special Awards Classes. Our Special Awards Classes are entirely intended to provide a method for our novice judges to gain valuable judging experience. The Hungarian Vizsla Society would encourage you to please support and enter these classes – *thank you*.

IF YOUR DOG IS BEATEN IN ANY OF THE SPECIAL AWARD CLASSES, IT WILL NOT BE CLASSED AS A BEATEN DOG FOR THE MAIN SHOW. THE DOG WILL STILL BE ABLE TO COMPETE FOR AN AWARD IN THE MAIN SHOW.

Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog. If your dog is found to be at risk forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

(N.B. The word 'doa' includes both sexes)

In the following definitions, a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows. In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials each partner must at the time of entry be a member of the Society. In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the first closing date shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **Monday, 9th October 2023**.

Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in breed classes but when entering in Variety classes, wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First prizes awarded in any classes defined as Special do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:-

- (1) Withdrawal
 - The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation F.(1).19.
- (2) Transfer
 - a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its colour, sex, weight or height the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and, in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted to the Open class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy Class, Puppy Class or Junior Class, which is over age but under twelve calendar months of age, eighteen calendar months of age or 24 calendar months of age respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy Class, Junior Class or Yearling Class respectively for the correct colour, sex, weight or height and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling Class to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - c) For any reason other than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open Class for the correct colour, sex, weight or height.
 - d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

MINOR PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

PUPPY For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

NOVICE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or three or more First Prizes at Open and Championship Shows (Minor Puppy, Special Minor Puppy, Puppy and Special Puppy classes excepted, whether restricted or not).

POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

LIMIT For dogs which have not become show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars or won 7 or more First Prizes in all at Championship Shows in Limit or Open Classes confined to the Breed, whether restricted or not at Shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

VETERAN For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the first day of the Show.

FIELD TRIAL For dogs which have won prizes, Diplomas of Merit or Certificates of Merit in actual competition at a Field Trial held under Kennel Club or Irish Kennel Club Field Trial Regulations.

BRACE For two exhibits (either sex or mixed) of one breed belonging to the same exhibitor, each exhibit having been entered in some class other than Brace or Team.

SPECIAL AWARD JUNIOR For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the first day of the Show.

SPECIAL AWARD POST GRADUATE For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate/CACIB/CAC/Green Star or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit and Open classes, whether restricted or not where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

SPECIAL AWARD OPEN For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the Show.

ADVISORY NOTICE

NOT FOR COMPETITION Societies may at their discretion, accept Not for Competition entries. Societies may accept such entries from breeds of dog not included within the title of the Society and at Shows held over more than one day, such entries may be accepted on any day from any breed.


NOTICES

- An exercise area is provided. If a dog fouls any part of the venue, including the exercise area, it is THE EXHIBITOR'S RESPONSIBILITY TO CLEAN IT UP. PLEASE KEEP THIS VENUE CLEAN
- 2. Please make sure that children are well behaved and correctly supervised.
- 3. Please observe the 'Dog No-Go' area.
- 4. The Committee will not accept any responsibility for products sold or advertised by stand holders at the show. The products may not meet the requirements of the Kennel Club regulations for the preparation of Dogs for Exhibition F.

RULES and REGULATIONS

- 1. The Show will open at 10.00 am.
- 2. Dogs will be received at any time after the opening of the show but it is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that dogs are available for judging when required.
- 3. Judging will commence at 10.30 am.
- Exhibits may be removed from the Show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.
- 5. Entry Fees: Members: First Entry per dog £6.50; each subsequent entry with same dog £1.50. Non-Members: First entry per dog £7.50; each subsequent entry with same dog £1.50. Special Awards: £2.00 per class. Not for Competition: £2.00 per dog (see Rule 18). Catalogues: £3.00 pre-paid with entries ONLY. Catalogue Adverts: £10.00 Full Page; £5.00 Half Page.
- Prize Money: Best in Show £15.00; Reserve Best in Show £10.00; Best Puppy in Show £10.00. Vouchers: Best in Show £30.00: Best Puppy in Show £20.00; Best Veteran in Show £20.00; £10.00 for each 1st place in the Special Awards Classes.
- 7. The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- 8. Puppies under six calendar months of age on the first day of the Show are not eligible for exhibition.
- The mating of bitches within the precincts of the Show is forbidden.
- 10. Best Puppy in Show Where a Best Puppy in Show competition is scheduled the Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.
- 11. Best in Show Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.
- 12. Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time, and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.
- 13. Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them <u>nor handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move</u>. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.
- All exhibitors must be familiar with Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.
- 15. All dogs resident outside of the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/ competitor.
- 16. **Dog's in Vehicles on Hot Days.** Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.
 - When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
 - If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
 - The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available
 to drink.
 - Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
 - When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
 - Keep the dog in the shade take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
 - Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.
 Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results.
 Please look after your dog's welfare. WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.
- 17. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the Board for disciplinary action under the Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. The use of pinch collars, electronic shock collars, or prong collars, is not permitted at any show licensed by the Kennel Club. This shall apply at the venue or within the precincts of the show.
- Not for Competition entries will be accepted. Details of each dog so entered must be recorded on the entry form and must be Kennel Club registered.
- No modifications will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the Board of the Kennel Club, which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.
- 20. Right to refuse entries. Exhibitors/Competitors are reminded that show societies have the right under Kennel Club Regulation to refuse any entry.
- Should the Judge be prevented from fulfilling their engagement the committee reserve to themselves the right of appointing
 another judge to fulfill their duties. Exhibitors are at liberty to withdraw from competition but no entry fees can be returned.
- 22. Exhibitors are held responsible for any loss or damage done by their dogs whilst within the precincts of the showground. The Society will not be responsible for accidents to persons or dogs at the Show.
- 23. Should the Show be cancelled for whatever reason, entry fees will not be returned.
- 24. Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling caused by their dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.
- 25. The owner, exhibitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog at Kennel Club licensed events must at all times ensure that the dog is kept under proper control whilst at the licensed venue, including its environs, car and caravan parks and approaches. This Regulation applies before (at any time during the set up period at the venue), during the event and afterwards (at any time during the breakdown of the event).
